### Class of 2010!





The initial visit was to give the students an insight into the world of business, with particular attention to the retailing sector. The students task was to take part in a merchandising challenge which would culminate in them selling their chosen items at the Newcastle Eagles' Basketball game against Worthing Thunder in April, 2010.

This group of students were divided into two teams. The first team decided to sell a range of glow products and sports' horns. The other team devised a foam basketball with points on the side. This was designed to wave around whenever the Eagles scored a basket.


