This summer saw improved exam results for most departments at Castle View Enterprise Academy as well as some outstanding individual performances from students. Here are some brief highlights:

- Once again all students got five or more good qualifications with over half getting them at A*-C including English and maths.
- The Maths Department excelled with over 70% of students getting a grade C or better.
- 43% of all students got an A or A* grade in at least one subject which shows really clearly the calibre of students coming into the Academy.
- Over 90% of students gained an ICT qualification that should stand them in good stead in the technological world we live in.
- The History Department got its best-ever figures with 88% earning a grade C or above and over 50% of them at A/A* level. Newly appointed Mr Murphy was 'over the moon' with the History team's efforts.
- Many departments, such as Geography, PE, Science, English Literature and Art saw improved results again this year.
- Other departments kept up the already high standards from last year, such as Performing Arts, Business Studies and French.
- Castle View students showed how much they enjoyed the new-look RE curriculum which focuses on morals, points of view and modern life issues: Over half of them gained a grade C or better.

We are really proud of all our students but here are some individuals who really stood out:

- Sarah Champken shone bright with 8 A* and 4 A grades.
- Anna Walton also performed magnificently with 7 A* and 5 A grades.
- Ryan Scott was the best performing male student with 2 A*, 6 A and 2 B grades.
- Emily McCully worked really hard and gave up lots of her time for her 3 Bs, 5 Cs and 2 D grades.
- Karl Parker attended all study support lessons and residentials to earn his 2 As, 4 Bs and 3 C grades.
- Matthew Moon shone through with 2 As, 4 Bs and 3 C grades.

A special mention must go to Brandon Barker who overcame significant difficulties to achieve 3 Bs, 4 Cs and 1 D grade. We will miss all last year's Y11 but none more so than Brandon whose positive outlook rubbed off on everyone who knows him.

This year's Y11 are already preparing for their final hurdles and look forward to beating these impressive results.

Silver Award 2013/2014

In the summer term of last academic year, a Youth Sport Trust representative came into the Academy to visit the PE department to observe the sports provision that is offered. After viewing our facilities, curriculum and our commitment to extra-curricular sport the PE department was awarded Silver Partner Status with the Youth Sport Trust.



As a partner school we demonstrate how to deliver high-quality school sport, improving the PE experiences of young people across the Academy.

Annette Montague, Education Director at the Youth Sport Trust, said:

“Youth Sport Trust Partner Schools share our belief that sport changes lives and understand how it can be used across the curriculum to improve attainment. PE and school sport can be a catalyst for young people to live healthy, active lives and we are delighted to be working with schools across the country to support them to develop this provision.

We have an increasing number of schools applying for our partner school status, which is a testament to the ongoing commitment that schools have in making a difference for young people and creating a world class system for PE and sport.”

New half-a-million pounds facility opened at Castle View Enterprise Academy by Kevin Ball (SAFC) to boost grassroots sport in Sunderland

A state-of-the-art half-a-million pound facility was officially opened at Castle View Enterprise Academy in Sunderland, thanks to a 54% grant from the Premier League and The FA Facilities Fund, which provides grants towards developing new grassroots football facilities.

The grant has enabled **Castle View Enterprise Academy** to provide both its pupils and the local community with a much-needed world class training facility in the North Sunderland area. The new 3G facility will not only help develop the skills of talented footballers, it will also help increase participation levels in football ; from grassroots through to senior level.

The new facility comprises a full-sized 11-a-side 3G pitch, which can be split into three playing areas suitable for small-sided games and training sessions. Furthermore there are also high-quality male and female changing facilities as well as onsite parking.



The funding by the Premier League, The FA, and the Government, via Sport England and the FA Facilities Fund is delivered by the Football Foundation. This is the country's largest sports charity. Since it was launched in 2000, the Foundation has awarded around 13,000 grants, worth more than £500m towards improving grassroots sport. It has used this to attract additional partnership funding of more than £700m – over £1.2bn of investment into the grassroots game.

By providing more high-quality facilities, coupled with coaching at the appropriate age group, the Premier League and The FA Facilities Fund aims to improve the experience for regular players as well as attracting new players to the game.



Many of the new state-of-the-art facilities will serve to strengthen the connection between professional football clubs and their local communities, particularly in the most deprived areas of the country, through the professional clubs' community trusts' outreach work.

Mrs Janet Bridges, Principal at Castle View Enterprise Academy, said "we are thrilled to be able to offer our world-class facility to our students and the wider community. The pitch is outstanding and we are very excited to see The Football Academy at Castle View Enterprise Academy develop into a major hub for football development and coaching in the North East."



Paul Thorogood, Chief Executive of the Football Foundation, added: "The Football Foundation is responsible for managing and delivering the Premier League and The FA Facilities Fund, which is funded by the Premier League, The FA and the Government, via Sports England. This new facility at Castle View Enterprise Academy is an example of the positive impact that this funding is having on our grassroots game. First-class facilities like this are crucial to creating more opportunities for local people to enjoy regular sport."

Aided by Durham County FA, Castle View Enterprise Academy deserves huge credit for taking a vision and turning it into a reality, using funding provided by the Premier League and The FA Facilities Fund. Sport has the power to make a positive impact on the health of communities and this wonderful new facility will improve the sporting experience of local people and encourage them to be more active."
