#### Staff forum

Staff from Castle View School met on 25 September 2008 to discuss how they would like to develop their new academy. Staff discussed new lunch arrangements particularly students staying in the academy over lunchtime. They also began to plan how they would like to develop their new curriculum areas inside the new building. Daily procedures for staff and students were among the main issues to be decided.

#### Student forum

Mrs Bridges has met with Paul Marsden to agree how and when students will represent their school. This group will focus on the existing school council and the group will look at the school uniform. Lots of samples will be presented to the students and they will be able to have a voice on their new school uniform. Rumour has it that Mrs Bridges favours straw hats – be assured this is just a rumour and we hope to give students something which is modern business like and up to date. Straw hats are NOT part of the plans!!!

## Community and residents forum

The group were very enthusiastic about the new academy. Parents, local residents and community groups discussed how the academy would integrate into the wider community. The main issues arising from the meeting focused on the use of the academy facilities for the community at night and weekends, more activities and clubs for local children, links with the sponsor for local community members and current school governors. Existing governors and parents from Castle View School attended the meeting and requested Northumbrian Water look at ways they can be represented in the new academy. Northumbrian Water are delighted by this and will meet with parents and governors at the next meeting to agree a way forward. Various community groups and agencies discussed how they operated with the existing school and how they would like to develop their services in conjunction with the academy.

## Ahead of schedule!

Construction is slightly ahead of programme with the structural steel frame, ground and first floor slabs all complete. The majority of the roof structure is in place and interior blockwork and partitions are nearing completion. The exterior brickwork and cladding is progressing as planned, along with fixing of windows and glazing.

The external drainage is complete, including the new outfall into the Hylton Dene for surface water run-off, and work has begun on the interior drainage, together with installation of the mechanical and electrical building services.
