sidered the policies and priorities of each party, students received their polling cards and were invited to vote at the CVEA polling booth.



PIXL The Edge Programme

As part of our Key Stage 3 Lifeskills Programme all students complete the PiXL The Edge Apprentice Award.

To achieve the award students must demonstrate progress in the 5 key LORIC skills of leadership, organisation, resilience, initiative and communication.

Students do this through participating in a range of activities. These range from writing a book review to leading a warm up session in PE to completing a mindfulness course.

To date, 59 of our Year 9 students have successfully completed ten LORIC activities and have been awarded their Apprentice certificates.

Students will now work towards their Graduate Awards which they aim to achieve by the end of Year 10.

This term was another full of sporting success for our teams. Our girls football teams were hugely successful in various tournaments, our boys football teams progressed in the nationals, we had dance students scouted, and our athletics teams competed in different competitions. Our Year 8 girls also played their first ever 9-a-side games. The Year 9 boys booked their place in the last 64 of the Nationals as well. A great month for sport.

Year 7 and Year 8 Girls Football

It has been an impressive term for our Year 7 and Year 8 girls football teams. In their first ever competitive event at Kepier, in a mini league of five teams, our Year 7 girls football team finished joint champions with Hetton, thanks to the following results: CVEA 0-1 St Anthony's CVEA 0-0 Hetton CVEA 3-1 Kepier CVEA 1-0 RedHouse. This is an amazing achievement for their first event.

Year 7 and Year 8 Girls Football: 6 a Side Tournament

Mr McKenna took two teams out to compete in a 6-a-side tournament against girls from Sunderland, Washington, Durham and Peterlee. The competition was originally aimed at Year 8s, however, as we had a great following of Year 7 girls, we were the only school to enter a Year 7 team. The tournament comprised four groups with the winners of each group qualifying for the semi-finals and then a final to decide who would represent Sunderland AFC at Huddersfield. The results were as follows: CVEA 7s 1-3 Whitburn Academy A, CVEA 7s 3-0 Hetton A, Biddick 1-0 CVEA 7s, CVEA 7s 2-0 St Bedes. The Year 8 results were as follows: St Joseph's B 0-1 CVEA 8s, CVEA 8s 1-3 St Bedes A, CVEA 8s 2-0 St Anthony's, Southmoor 3-0 CVEA 8s. Both teams finished third and narrowly missed out on the semis, huge well done girls.

Year 8 Girls Win the Tournament

Our Year 8 girls football team won their latest tournament, without conceding a goal. They beat RedHouse 6-0, Bede 4-0, and Kepier 7-0. Emmi Weiss scored a hat trick in every game. The Houghton Kepier game was stopped at 8-0.

Athletics and Dance.

The Academy athletics team and dance students had a busy term. Mr McKenna and Miss Keys took out four teams of students from Year's 7, 8 and 9 to represent the school at the Wearside cross country championships competing against students from nine different schools, with six of our Year 7 students finishing in the top ten, with one student finishing third, and one of our Year 9 students finishing first. Huge well done to all students. We also took 15 students to an Indoor Athletics competition in Sunderland, with a number of first place finishes in all athletics events. Well done to all who were involved!

In dance, four of our Dance students were "noticed" by professional dancer / choreographer Geoff Hopson who was talent scouting for Dance City's Centre for Advanced Training programme (a contemporary dance company for 10-16 year olds). This is an amazing opportunity for the students who were scouted. Very well deserved.



Thank you to all who participated in our Christmas Jumper Day.


We raised £394.87 for Save the Children, a brilliant effort by all staff and students involved.
